Objectives

This training is particularly designed for the public healthcare management (MPH), nursing and medical students and their faculty members from different universities in US. Its main objective is to orient them on the aspects of Indian healthcare delivery system. To make the discussion interactive, participants could be invited to share their perspective on US healthcare delivery system and status in related areas.

Content

The discussion will focus on the following issues:

- Healthcare delivery system in India: Evolution, policies and present status
- Primary healthcare system in India – Evolution, structure, norms, achievements etc.
(The discussion will be followed by a field visit to a community health centre in a near by area)
- Epidemiology of Healthcare in India- Communicable and non-communicable diseases, current trends and rates
- Key National Healthcare Programs: National Rural Health Mission, Population Growth Challenges and Management, National AIDS Control Program
- Safe Drinking water and Sanitation-Challenges and management

- Nutrition Concerns- Current status (particularly in relation to women, adolescents and children), Challenges and programs (for example, *anganwadi* centres, mid-day meals in schools, nutritional supplements for pregnant women and adolescents)
- Urban Healthcare Challenges
- Health Information and Monitoring System
- Health Program Evaluation

Training Approach

The training style consists of lectures, discussions, case study, exercises, group work and field visits. The programme will be based on experiential learning and participatory approach. The lead concepts will be introduced by resource persons through lectures followed by discussions. Issues will be raised and identified through brainstorming and exercises through group work and presentations.
